5. To receive reports from:

I. Chairman: This will be my last Chairman's Report as, I'm sure you're all aware, I am standing down from the post and would like to take this opportunity to say a big 'Thank You' to all members who have helped through the years to make the Society such a success.

For the past five or six years, adverse weather has been against beekeepers in Wales so I am glad to report that we had a good summer at last, with many hours of sunshine, which enabled the bees to get out to the

plentiful forage. A number of people have told me that 2014 gave the best yield of honey they have ever had.

In 2014, things went well in the Society and I will mention just a few of them. Please forgive me if I don't mention everyone by name, there are just too many to do so.

The Apiary

This past year the Apiary, under the watchful eye of the Apiary Management team led by Stephen Davies, has gone from strength to strength. For the first time it produced a surplus of honey, 120 lb, which was sold to Llys Nini and bought from their shop almost as fast as Steve could deliver it. Also a number of nucs were produced by the team and sold to members of the Beginners' Class. I understand that 7 colonies are looking good and will be going into next season.

The apiary also saw a number of 'Taster Days' being run which introduced people to the craft of beekeeping.

The Bee Tent

In 2014 there were again 5 outings for the Bee Tent namely: the RWAS Spring Fair in May, the Wales Game Fair in June, the Bridgend Show in July, The Gower Show and the Vale of Glamorgan Show, both in August. The team, led by Julian Caruana, enthralled the public with the display which encouraged a number of people to join our beginners' classes.

The Education Group

The classes were again held at Pontarddulais Comp, moving out to the Apiary as soon as the weather permitted. The Education team, led by Nicola Oulton, taught a number of people who have since gone on to get colonies and become beekeepers in their own right. Three Swarm Class sessions and a Disease Recognition workshop were also held at the school. This year Nicola Oulton and Steve Davies passed the Microscopy module exam, with Stephen also passing module 7 'Selection & Breeding of Honey Bees' and module 8 'Honey Bee management Health and History', this year ahead I have been told 12 people are taking the Basic Assessment.

The Gower Show

Our premier show of the year at Penrice Castle again saw us in our own marquee, thanks to the efforts of the team, led by Gill Lyons, who persuaded the Gower Agricultural Committee that we were worthy of the privilege. Indeed, many visitors to the show told us that ours was indeed the best tent in the show. In 2014, a new class was introduced in the schedule, the 'Novices Class', aimed at encouraging beginners to show their honey for the first time and in that, it was very successful. It was wonderful to see the reaction of people who managed to win a prize card for the first time, the joy on their faces made it all worthwhile.

Society Events

The Con Club meetings have gone from strength to strength, often with talks on the second Tuesday of the month including some fun things like the Society Honey Show and How to Make Wax Flowers. Other events were a Nosema Check evening and a Wax Day at Hilary & Mike Rose's house.

The Christmas Dinner at the Greyhound was well attended and the raffle prize of a turkey, donated by Ian Roberts, was won by Tom Davis's daughter, Jane.

My thanks go to Committee members who have helped steer the Society and to those who have volunteered their help through the year. Without you, this Society could not exist. And now, I would like to wish my successor as Chairman, all the best in the task and offer my help, if required, in any way that I can.

II. Secretary; Firstly I would like to mention our outgoing Chairman. I first joined in 2001 when I did the beginners course with David.

The Newsletter was distributed by Royal Mail as was other communication. Luckily there were less than 35 members. David kept doing the beginners class which is now being led by our Education Officer and the total Membership is up at about a 100 each year. I'm quite sure if it was not for David's efforts we would have not had a growing Society. Both David and I were able to cover all of the WBKA and MSWCC Meetings. It has been a delight working with David and I look forward to continuing to work with him.

It has been another busy year with the general public contacting me about bees, members having problems with the temperament of their bees, redoing the Constitution and over the past six weeks doing the membership renewals.

The general public contacted me about swarms and provided they were accessible, I'd send an email out to everyone. If the bees were inaccessible, I pointed them in the right direction to get their problems sorted out.

This year was the first year that I have had problems with the 'June Gap' and my bees and some other people's bees became anti-social. The 'June Gap' is when there is a break in the forage that the bees can feed on and in my case, it meant that they were dive bombing anyone who went out in the garden. Like other people who had a problem, I had to move my bees.

This brings me to the native bee project on Gower and the bees I would like to have – steady, consistent, less likely to swarm and nice to work with just to name a few traits. I want to draw people into this project.

Apart from the 'June Gap' and if people had been able to stop their bees from swarming, many people had a good crop of honey this year.

The WBKA has seen the Chairman, Secretary and Editor step down this year. They also have a problem with minutes coming out weeks after the meetings. I'm not sure what is going on.

The MSWCC had an excellent Convention at Pershore and it has got problems with some counties not being able to run it, however, the next one will be at Cirencester in 2015 followed by us in 2016.

Redoing the constitution has been a challenge. The present version isn't perfect, but what we will be doing is to pass it through in its present version and look at it again in the future.

Although our membership goes from the 1st Jan to the 31st Dec in a year, by the cut-off date of the 25th Jan, less than half had re-joined by this date. We are now up to over 80 members.

III. Treasurer; I am pleased to present the Annual Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2014. These have been audited by Roger Thomas, Chartered Certified Accountant.

These Accounts have been circulated to all of our membership by email in what I call a "one-sheet summary". Should you wish to see the breakdown of the figures please let me know and I can email the full 3-page edition which goes into more detail.

2014 was a successful year. The income exceeded the costs by over £1000. The weather was better than in the last few years. The Class was well attended, The Bee Tent continued in popularity – although the individual donations were disappointing – but this is to be discussed by the Committee. The sales of honey were better – which reflects on the happiness of the bees and the weather; and this also resulted in the Apiary being able to offer honey to Llys Nini for sale under their label. Of course, this has already been mentioned by our Chairman, David Salkilld.

Of course success requires costs. The only sum that may require some clarification relates to the Apiary. It is expanding and needed additional

equipment, such as the 5 hives required. This Apiary is a great asset to our Society. Not only does it act as an addition to the Class but it is a benefit to ALL members. Some may appreciate it to extend their knowledge (no-one can claim they know everything about beekeeping, you can always pick up tips/useful wisdom), others may be able to assist by demonstrating to new beekeepers). I am probably one of the worst to say this but I would recommend it to ALL members. Visit it, see what is going on, participate..

It is the duty of the Treasurer to present the Accounts to Members but the substance, having been audited, is beyond question. It is unusual at an AGM to answer questions but I am willing to break this convention and answer short queries on content.

Oh!, as a Footnote:

There is one small piece of useless information I will share with you.

In spite of all that has happened in the last 4 years – the introduction of the Bee tent, the apiary, grants received, etcetera – The difference between the current account opening balance on 1st January 2011 and the closing balance on 31st December 2014 is a decrease of £84.75

Nicola Oulton commented that Paul Lyons was not available to answer
those comments.

Delegates for WBKA and MSWCC;

10. Ratification of Constitution update:

Adrian Bowen asked for clarification of section 4 "member is anyone who has beekeeping as a hobby". When members sell honey and bees etc. are they precluded from being a member?

David Salkildd clarified that unless a member is a bee farmer with 400 colonies then they are hobbyists.
